The state of the ponds is an ongoing concern.  
Older villagers maintain that the level of the water was  
always pretty high in the past. This has not been the case  
over the last few years.  
Village pump near Clematis villa needs attention if it is to be  
retained.

Tree preservation is a constant worry.  
The first replacements appeared to be taken from the  
original trees + consequently suffered in the same way.  
Hopefully the new ones will do better. Great mixture of housing  
seems to have been allowed in this area.
