Situation

- 6. The Council adopted its Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) in July 2006 following the statutory process. The document sets out the Council's approach to public consultation and involvement in the preparation of the Local Plan, other development plan documents and in the determination of planning applications.
- 7. Due to changes in legislation an update of the SCI is needed to ensure it accords with relevant current regulations.
- 8. On the 8th March 2013 the LDF Working Group agreed to a 6 week period of consultation for the Draft SCI. The Draft SCI was posted on the website and emails/letters were sent to all Statutory Consultees, the consultation was also advertised through social media. The closing date was the 6th May.
- 9. 15 representations were received, 8 made no specific comments and supported the document the other 7 representations suggested changes and made general comments regarding past consultations.

Conclusion

10. The LDF Working Group considered the Report of Representations and proposed amendments to the SCI at its meeting on 14 June 2013. Following discussion the Working Group agreed to recommend the proposed amendments to the SCI to be adopted by Cabinet.
