Situation

- The Access Policy Statement defines how the Museum Service identifies and addresses issues of physical access (buildings, facilities, staff awareness) and intellectual access (provision of information in suitable formats) to meet the needs of visitors and users.
- 'Access assets' and work to date on accessibility are described, and issues for future attention are identified: these include ongoing re-labelling of galleries to improve visibility for the visually-impaired; a proposed Visitor Attraction Quality Assurance Service inspection; and making efforts to engage hard-to-reach' audiences (through outreach as part of Heritage Quest Centre project).
- Approval of the Access Policy Statement does not commit the Council to additional expenditure. Continuing improvements will be dealt with using existing resources and revenue, or through externally-funded projects (such as Heritage Quest Centre project / HLF).
