Summary

Situation

- 5 A process of contacting Parish and Town Councils to discuss possible Dog Control Orders has been carried out and a number of suitable sites have been identified where either a dog exclusion order or a requirement for owners to remove dog faeces and to put and keep their dog on a lead if directed to do so by an authorised officer, would be appropriate.
- 6 In addition to these specific sites it is suggested that all footpaths and verges which abut roads in 30mph (or less) areas be included in the requirement for owners to remove dog faeces and to put and keep their dog on a lead if directed to do so by an authorised officer.
- 7 For the Orders to be legally valid the procedure in the Dog Control Orders (Procedures) Regulations 2006 must be followed and the Council needs to be able to show that the Dog Control Orders are a necessary and proportionate response to problems caused by the activities of dogs and those in charge of them. It is also necessary to balance the interest of dog owners who need to exercise their animals with the interest of those such as children who need access to dog free areas.
- 8 A list of sites is attached as an annex to this report and suitable large scale maps will be available for the public consultation stage.
