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### **Summary**

- This is the first Budget Monitoring report to this Committee for the financial year 2008/09.
- Performance Select Committee, at its meeting on 29<sup>th</sup> April 2008 agreed the process for members to separately receive budget monitoring information direct.
- Reports are attached at Appendices A, B, C and D in the following structure:
  - Appendix A-Is a briefing note explaining where the figures come from, the principles of profiling budgets, and a guide to the various warning signs via the “faces”.
  - Appendix B-Level 1. This shows the net total for Community Committee, analysed for each service within the Committee.
  - Appendix C-Level 2 shows the Direct Costs and Direct Income for each service within the Committee.
  - Appendix D-Level 3 shows a more detailed breakdown for each service, together with comments from the Heads of Divisions (HoD’s) responsible for each service.

### Situation

- 1 Members will have recently received detailed budget monitoring information for all the Council's services.
- 2 The Appendices in this report only relate to the Community Committee.
- 3 Appendix B shows that overall, the Committee's net spending to the end of May is underspent by £108,709 against the profiled budgets for the same period.
- 4 Members should note that it is still very early in the financial year, and more meaningful monitoring figures will be produced as the year progresses.
- 5 In addition to the information being sent on services to all Councillors, a report on high profile budgets across the Council is submitted to the regular meetings between the Strategic Management Board and the political administration.
- 6 Performance Select Committee will monitor all budgets exceeding 10% of their variance from the profiled budget, and receive explanations from HoDs.
