Situation

- The Government is proposing policy changes as part of its response to the Barker Review of housing supply. The key headline issues are that the Government proposes greater weight should be attached to housing market considerations in setting the level of housing provision and that a new tax is proposed to capture some of the uplift in land values that accrues to landowners from the sale of their land for development in order to fund the infrastructure that is necessary to deliver growth.
- The new PPS25 on development and flood risk is intended to give greater clarity to Government policy and make it easier to understand.
- The appended reports from the Chair of the Regional Technical Advisers Group to the Regional Planning Panel on these proposals form a helpful platform from which to formulate the Council's response. The deadline for responses is 27 February.
