Situation

Uttlesford Futures Assembly – Thursday 7 December 2006

- 4 Uttlesford Futures held its annual meeting on Thursday 7 December. Approximately 80 people attended. Presentations were given on the current status of Uttlesford Futures, a draft state of the district well-being report, the Local Development Framework and updates were provided on the work that has been undertaken by various sub-groups.
- 5 The afternoon sessions provided participants with an opportunity to influence the future work of Futures in the areas of Safer and Stronger Communities, Children and young People, Healthier Communities and Older People, Economic Development and the Environment.
- 6 The workshops resulted in two new sub-groups being established – Economic Development and The Environment. These groups will be tackling a range of issues from green travel plans, improving bus services to access to services and educational opportunities.
