Situation

- As members are aware, Uttlesford District Council were successfully selected to take part in the Rural Excellence Programme for Strategic Housing and Affordable Rural Housing. This involved working with the Regional Development Agency, Government Office and Town and Parish Councils to solve the most important housing issues for the locality. It also provided Uttlesford with the opportunity to lead the way in the development of rural housing.
- 6 Four objectives were agreed :
 - Publicising the evaluation of affordable rural housing schemes in order to gain wider engagement and support for such schemes.
 - Development of Parish Planning.
 - Understanding of how, and ability to, influence the Housing Corporation to access funding.
 - Relationship with Parish Councils to enable the communities to influence the Planning Policy Frameworks.
- 7 Throughout the programme, Officers were learning about good practice in delivering affordable rural housing. It has enabled us to adopt a model for evaluating affordable housing schemes on exception sites, develop closer links with the Sustainable Communities Strategy, work with partners to ensure that affordable housing features as a target within the new Local Area Agreement and also organise a rural housing conference on 13th March to highlight good practice to Parish Councils.
- 8 The mentors put forward the following recommendations and the following progress has been made:
