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Situation

- 1 As part of the annual budget setting process, the Council sets the budget for its Capital Programme. The first stage is for officers to consider the progress of those schemes that have been approved in earlier years, and to identify potential new schemes. Each committee then considers those schemes that are relevant to its own portfolio of services, and makes a recommendation to this Committee for those schemes which Members consider should be included in the programme. This Committee therefore needs to first consider schemes relating to its own services, prior to looking at the Council's overall Capital Programme and proposed financing at the meeting on TBC. Development of the programme involves updating of the current year's budget as well as identifying schemes that occur in each of the three subsequent years.
- 2 The proposed programme for this Committee is attached as Appendix 1 to this report. The schedule of schemes is divided in to those previously approved, and hence already in the programme, and those which are new schemes for consideration. Where relevant, notes accompany those schemes listed in order to identify any factors that have occurred which have impacted upon the progress of existing schemes.
- 3 In essence, this Committee's schemes are divided between Information Technology schemes, which have already been considered and supported by a meeting of the Member IT Working Group on 7th January 2007, and other schemes.
