#### Situation

- 5. In 2006/07 the Council commenced a programme of conservation area appraisals using resources from a government delivery grant for planning activities. At the time, the percentage of Conservation Areas in a local authority's area with an appraisal and management plan was a national performance indicator.
- 6. Each of the six appraisals completed has an associated management plan, with recommendations falling into three categories: boundary changes to the conservation area boundary, suggested environmental enhancements and Article 4 Directions. The latter have the effect of making planning permission necessary for works that would otherwise not require an application.
- 7. Recommended boundary changes to conservation areas have been made. The Council has no budget provision to carry out or enable environmental enhancements, however, and Article 4 Directions have not been progressed either. The Development Control division has not had the capacity to carry out the associated consultation, analysis and preparation of a case for each proposed direction to the Secretary of State.
