The staff concerned would not need to have the same level of knowledge as specialised back office staff, who would continue with administering the majority of more complex claims.

- 5 Changes in the Council's approach to customer contact, together with managerial and staffing changes have since delayed full evaluation and implementation of E-Benefits. However, Officers from relevant services have recently met to establish the way forward. Subject to completing the evaluation, it is intended that E-Benefits will now be made available to UConnect staff as an aid to gathering information from certain new Benefit claimants. It would also be made available when a home visit is needed to certain Benefit claimants. A target date of 31 January 2008 has been set for completing this task.
