Amendment to Vehicle Licensing Conditions

Situation

- The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, which has been adopted by this Council, allows for conditions to be placed upon the licensing of Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Vehicles. These conditions are primarily targeted at the safety issues that effect public transport within this district.
- All of the current conditions are kept under review due to the motor manufacturing industry, coupled with new technology coming into the market place. Changes to our conditions have been made previously to take account of this.
- Operators within this District are aware of the new designs coming onto the market and regularly change their vehicles to meet the new demands placed upon them.
- Currently the operator, Checker Cars, who are based at Stansted Airport, are proposing to take delivery of the brand new Ford Galaxy which now no longer comes with a spare wheel. Our present conditions require that a spare wheel is carried on all of our licensed vehicles so that the vehicle is not stranded, especially with passengers on board if a puncture occurs.
- At the present time, we have a multi purpose and multi manufacturers fleet which would still require a spare wheel to be carried, especially those operators who solely specialise in school transport work.
- The amendment to our conditions does have the support of the Vehicle and Operator Services Agency, subject to the caveat that for a temporary repair of a tyre using an aerosol then the vehicle is subjected to a maximum speed limit of 50 mph and does not exceed 100 miles after the temporary repair has been made. This primarily will allow the vehicle to either return to its base or complete the passenger's journey. However, VOSA are primarily concerned with safety and not the comfort or convenience of passengers.
- Pirelli have declined to comment upon the suitability of aerosol repair kits referring officers instead to Ford Motor Company. Letters have been sent to Ford, Michelin and Goodyear, but at the time of preparation of this report we still await responses from Michelin and Goodyear. Any reply received before the Committee meeting will be reported verbally.
- Anecdotal evidence is that aerosol repair kits do not always function. In the event of a car suffering a puncture which could not be repaired using the aerosol there is potential for significant inconvenience to fare paying passengers who maybe being carried at the time.
- 9 Checker Cars currently operate a Private Hire Service at Cardiff and Gatwick airports whereby both local authorities permit the Ford Galaxy to be used without the requirement of a spare wheel.
