We wish to raise our objections to the proposed extension of the existing licence held by the above club.

We live some 300 m from the club house. The sound of loud music etc clearly travels and can be heard particularly during the summer months with the windows open. Although this is irritating at times, the current arrangement seems a fair compromise between those wishing to enjoy partying and those involved in quieter pursuits. The proposed extension to 0001hrs is completely unacceptable.

We suggest the following:

The licence to run from 1200hrs -2300 hrs on Sunday, from 1900hrs - 2300hrs Monday -Thursday, 1900hrs - 2400hrs on Friday and 1100hrs - 2400hrs on Saturday. Sale of alcohol should to be linked to these times.

The other consideration should be for the occupants who are about to move into the new houses. They will be living almost on top of the venue. We suggest a delay in granting any new extension to the licence.



I am writing to object to the proposed extension of hours for the sale of alcohol and inclusion of live music at the Catons Lane Football Club. The reasons for my concerns are listed below:

- The noise from the football club does carry a long distance and playing music to 0001 on potentially any night of the week will be unfair to nearby residents who start work early in the morning
- While the alcohol sales will finish at 0001 during the week and 0100 at weekends, I believe
 that the extension will inevitably lead to increased noise through the night as patrons of the
 football club make their ways home through residential areas, particularly so for residents of
 the new homes being built next to Catons Lane.
- I assume that young children will be living in houses close to the football club. The expected increase in noise and disturbance late at night will be unfair to children of school age.
- Groups may use the football pitch currently under construction as a short cut to areas to the north of the town as they make their ways home from the club. I believe that this will be a particular problem during the summer months when windows are left open at night.



With reference to the Public Notice printed in Walden Local on 16 October, I would like to record my objection, for what its worth, to the extension to their existing Licence or Certificate for playing live or recorded music on any night till the hour of midnight. (In the newspaper the extension is advertised as 0100 hours, but I understand this is a misprint).

Having spoken with both Murray Hardy in your office and Anne Lee-Moore in Environmental Health, I understand that the hour of midnight is quite common as a cut-off time in our district, but would like to bring to your attention that at least on one occasion this year, in late September, I did have cause to call the police (no one available at the time of course) because extremely loud music was disturbing us when we were watching television with our double glazed windows closed, and the noise continued beyond midnight when we had gone to bed. This apparently emanated from the Cricket Club, which of course is virtually next door to the Football Club so we have experienced how sound can travel from that general location to our house.

My personal opinion is that any licence in a residential area should have a cut-off point at 2300 hours, particularly where live music is concerned, because that is what is usually the loudest.

Following on from your comments, I would ask that you agree to the wording of the conditions set out below. If you do, then the representation will state the agreement achieved, and I will recommend the same conditions are included in the terms of the licence:

- 1. The premises supervisor or representative shall regularly assess noise from the premises during amplified music events. Steps shall be taken to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause disturbance to residents.
- 2. Prominent and clear signage shall be displayed near exits and around the site requesting patrons and guests to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 3. The premises supervisor or representative shall ensure that providers of live or recorded music announce at least twice before the end of their act a request that patrons and guests leave quietly and quickly.
- 4. External doors and windows to be kept closed after 23.00hrs except for access and egress when live or recorded music is being played or performed.

Details of concern


The application site has residential properties 200m to the east and south which may be impacted by noise from the site, although the school building in Castle St will act as a noise barrier to reduce the impact on some properties directly to the south. The licence as applied for will allow amplified music to be played for extended periods from the existing time limits in place, and noise from music and patrons leaving the site at a later time has the potential to cause a public nuisance, unless suitable controls are exercised by the management of the club.

The following conditions to prevent public nuisance have been agreed with the applicant and I would recommend their inclusion in the licence:

- The premises supervisor or representative shall regularly assess noise from the premises during amplified music events. Steps shall be taken to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause disturbance to residents.
- 2. Prominent and clear notices shall be displayed near exits and around the site requesting patrons and guests to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 3. The premises supervisor or representative shall ensure that providers of live or recorded music announce at least twice before the end of their act a request that patrons and guests leave quietly and quickly.
- External doors and windows to be kept closed after 23.00hrs except for access and egress when live or recorded music is being played or performed.
- 5. The premises supervisor or representative shall monitor the car park for noise from customers. Steps shall be taken to encourage customers to leave quietly and quickly.




SAFFRON WALDEN TOWN F. C. PLAN CLUBHOUSE. SCALE 1 TO 100 DRAWN BY KCV



Annexe 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory conditions - supply of alcohol

- 1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or
- at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
- 2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (1) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Embedded Conditions of 1964 Act

No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- (1) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- (2) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (3) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- (4) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.
- In this condition "bar" includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.
