Dear Mr Hardy

Apologies for the last minute comments re the above application but I would like to make the following points:

I am keen to have our pub back so support the application for the sale of alcohol and the other activities indoors up to 11pm on any day; however, we live not much more than 500m from the pub across fields, and believe that the activities of films, recorded and live music outside after 11pm (10:30 on Sundays) would be a public nuisance and potentially harmful to children who have to sleep and get up the next day for school.

The problem with selling alcohol and the other activities indoors after 11pm is that people leave the pub when it closes and the traffic will be noisy, again a nuisance.

I understand that the landlord will be able to apply for 12 temporary event notices per year anyway, which would seem to me to be more than sufficient.

#### Dear Mr Hardy

We are writing to you in connection with the licence application for the Plough public house in Radwinter.

We live at Hallam, Sampford Road, Radwinter which is approximately 150m from the Plough. We have a young family.

We wish to raise our concerns in regard to the following parts of the application:

Live music indoors and outdoors Monday to Wednesday 10am to 11.30pm, Thursday 10am to 12 midnight, and Friday 10am to 1am

Recorded music indoors and outdoors the same days and times as live music

Films indoors and outdoors the same days and times as live music

The concerns that we raise on the above are due to expected noise levels outside the pub after 11pm, in what is otherwise a very quite residential area. The public house has operated in the past without the requirement for regular outside activities after 11pm. We believe the application above be obtrusive to us and the surrounding neighbourhood, and could lead to a public nuisance after 11pm. We also believe that regular outside music or film events would create a noise disturbance that is otherwise not a current concern. We enjoy living in a quite residential area within a small village. We have no issue on the granting of an occasional licence under the term Temporary Event Notices and these would need to be restricted to Friday and Saturday evenings only.

In respect of the application for the sale of alcohol on and off the premises, from 9am is unnecessary. In our opinion the sale of alcohol should not be before 10.30am. For the reasons above we would object to the granting of a sale of alcohol licence beyond 12 midnight on a Friday and Saturday, and beyond 11pm on any other day of the week. This would in our opinion lead to noise outside after those times in an otherwise quite residential area. We also understand there is a proposal to extend the public car park and this would lead to increased noise from cars late at night, and having cars depart after 1am should a licence be granted would increase noise levels at that time which would be obtrusive to us. We would strongly object to the granting of any outside drinking licence beyond 11pm on any day of the week due to noise levels.

Following notice about the licence application, I phoned David Miles on 10th November 2013 and was told the following, as extracted from an email I sent to some concerned villagers:-

"I have just a perfectly civilised conversation with David Miles who, in summary, told me the following:-

He will be withdrawing the outside activities licence application save for that part which deals with the "consumption of alcohol". He acknowledged that he had pitched "high" in order to get what he wants;

I was told that this has been formally submitted. It is unlikely, however, that the public notices will be changed. I said that this was a pity as it is precisely these which had caused the stir;

He does not expect the licence to be granted this side of Xmas and that it is likely to go to a hearing;

He will deal with events by Temporary Event Notices. He is restricted to 12 of these per year;

He is intending to keep the application for inside events as it is and there will be a noise level set for the boundary of the pub after 2300 [I am not clear how this will work in practice but I understand the spirit behind the comment];

The inside hours application will remain as is, as will the outside request for the "consumption of alcohol":

There will be an application to turn the pegged out land in the corner of the field into a mix of car park and pub garden:

He needs to have sufficient car parking space in order to make the pub profitable. I assured him that we were looking for a compromise which made the pub a profitable going concern as we all want it as a community resource;

He will be keeping the exit as recently approved and that this unlikely to be put into effect until next year: ie the old arrangements will remain in place for awhile yet;

He is unlikely to be opening as planned; and

He thinks Radwinter is a noisy place to live!

It is a pity that this information had not been made available to the village sooner.

From what I have been told, I can see that some residual concerns may remain in relation to:-

Noise resulting from drinking outside after 2300;

Noise outside after 2300 when people leave the pub;
 How the enlarged car park will work in practice; and

How the enlarged car park will look when finished.

Issues in relation to the enlarged car park clearly fall to be determined when the planning application is lodged. The other two points are part of the current licence application.

I understand that what I have reported may not allay the more specific, localised concerns of individual householders.

I hope, however, that this summary will help you all decide what, if anything, you wish to do about

the current licence application."

My email has been criticised by some as being a public criticism of the application. I do not accept that at all. It was an honest attempt to mediate a compromise.

If my email accurately reflects the position, then I am content save that I think the licence for thursday should be limited to 2300 and to 2359 for friday and saturday nights.

If the conversation does not accurately reflect the current position then, in addition, to what I have detailed in the previous paragraph, I would like to see the condition changed to remove carte blanche to outside music. The temporary events notice scheme is a perfectly reasonable way on balancing the need for Mr Miles to run a profitable concern with the valid worries of those who live near the pub.

I am not sure how a boundary noise restriction would work in practice.

I trust that my concerns are clear and reasonable.

I wish to express my concerns regarding the Licensing Application of the owner of the Plough Inn in Radwinter on the following grounds:

the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

I appreciate that the owner, Mr Miles, has possibly put in as wide an application as is possible; perhaps seeking greater permission than he actually needs or wants, however, as I have not had the opportunity to discuss this with him in person I still feel it is valid to raise my objections.

I believe that the application for the activities live music, recorded music and film outdoors would create unacceptable levels of noise pollution for the residents of Sampford Hill, Plough Hill and Mill End of which I am one. As I understand it, one-off events can be covered by a temporary event notice. I think the previous owner used the TENs on occasion very successfully.

Again, with a view to noise pollution, the request for the late closing time seems unusual for a country pub. I would think that midnight on Friday and Saturday was more usual and acceptable with a 10.30pm closing time Sunday to Thursday. - I am writing to register my objection to the application for a premises licence for The Plough Public House, Radwinter, Essex CB10 2TL
- 2. The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of public nuisance.
- 3. I am dismayed to find myself in the position whereby I mustact to object to the application to licence my local pub. In this application the applicant shows disregard for the wellbeing of people living in the area and this does not bode well for the future.
- 4. Local people have, for a number of years, looked forward to the reopening of our local pub and restaurant. We now find we are alienated by the hours and nature of the application and ask the Committee to consider the negative impact of this application on local people and how the noise and excessive hours of business will detract from the enjoyment of their homes and wellbeing.

#### Historical Evidence.

- 5. The Plough has had a number of events in the past, each has been licenced by a Temporary Events Notice (TEN). These events have allowed for the playing of music inside the pub until 11pm. Even so, these events attracted complaints from the centre of the village as well as those living closer to The Plough. I am aware that at least one of the events caused formal complaints to be raised with Environmental Health as well as direct to the publicanduring the evening of the event and the following day. I was able to confirm to Environmental Health the level of disturbance caused and, verify the formal complaint from the community. This evidence underlines that Radwinter, a small quiet village, has no tolerance of noise from The Plough.
- 6. The Plough has numerous properties in close proximity but, as it is located on a hill, the sound emanating from the site travels easily in any direction and has historically impacted on the centre of the village.
- 7. The Licence application is not consistent with that of avillage pub and restaurant, more a nightclub or venue for functions. The applicant is quoted as saying that has requested more in his licence than he requires so that he will get what he wants when it is cut back and that he will deal with events by up to 12 Temporary Event Notices a year.
- 8. In my following proposal I have balanced the needs for the pub to run as a viable business and the tolerance of local people. Here follows a table that moderates the hours of operation; the location and times for music (live and recorded) and, film.

We have recently received notification for a Premises Licence for the Plough Public House, Radwinter, CB10 2 TL. We understand that this may have been served by Uttlesford District Council however this is not clear because: it was undated, had no reference to sender or senders address..

Whilst we recognise that a Pub/Restaurant might be considered a village amenity, we strongly disagree with the proposed use of the building and the extent of the licence requested.

We have lived in Radwinter, on Plough Hill, Hempstead Road (approx 250 yards from the Plough) for over 15 years and have enjoyed the tranquillity of village life. In that time we have seen many changes of landlord at the Plough and at no time in the past has the use as a public house given us cause for concern. However this application has given us a great deal of concern, these are the issues we would like to see addressed:

Films indoors and outdoors and music outdoors up to 1 a.m. on some days. In a quiet area which
is surrounded by fields noise can carry a great distance and therefore suggest that this is not an
appropriate location for this type of premises or entertainment.

If permitted would the licence permit use of an outdoor marquee? We also feel that the fact that
the owners may apply yearly for up 12 events is more than sufficient for the location and type of
premises.

 The indoor appears to have a large dance floor. We are concerned that this might attract a great number of people from outside the village of Radwinter (i.e. Saffron Walden) and if permitted music finishing at any given time (i.e. 1 a.m.) has the potential for taxis and other traffic to leave the premises well into the following hour.

The road has its 'rush-hour' periods generally this is only during the normal working day peaks. We
feel this licence application has the potential to create further late night rush hour periods at the
end of any premises entertainment.

• We understand that a proposal will be made to build an extension to the car park or a new car park on adjoining land. We would not wish to see Hempstead Road as the entrance /exit as this will cause disruption to us and other residents on the opposite side of the road due to traffic noise and at night vehicle headlights shining direct in the dwellings (which are predominately bungalows). This area already causes several altercations between drivers who fail to observe the sign posting.

 A lack of suitable parking or potential over spill parking may lead to vehicles being left on the grass verges which will impede visibility for drivers at the crossroads and cause further concern for residents.

In summary, we are objecting to any form of licence for the regular provision of indoor and outdoor music or films and would welcome the restriction of outside alcohol consumption to 11.30 pm Fri & Sat and 11pm for the remainder of the week.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Plough Inn application for a Licence.

Before we start we think it important to note that we are broadly in favour of the public house and its success. However we have concerns about a number of issues outlined in this licensing application.

When the application was granted for alteration to the Plough Inn building in planning permission UTT/2022/11/FUL due regard was had to the environmental impact (reference condition 4, 5 and 7). In condition 7 the hours of construction work were limited to 7.30 hours to 18.00 hours Mondays to Fridays and 7.30 hours to 13.00 hours on Saturdays and at no time on Sundays or Bank Holidays in the interests of good neighbourliness. The current application requests a licence relating to outside activities for periods extending beyond these hours. It would be surprising to find that the Local Authority consenting to an activity likely to have a greater noise pollution impact and for longer hours than the lesser impact construction works. However, we accept that this is a Public House with the need to carry out activities in a profitable manner but this should not cause a public nuisance. The real issue here is the outside activities. A number of conditions in the planning permission have regard for the local community in the context of reducing any public nuisance. So we suggest that

save for alcohol consumption the outside activities are excluded from the licence consent and where

such activities are being considered the applicant makes one off applications as and when the need

arises up to a maximum of 12 a year.

When considering the application it is important to remember that the Public House is located

within a residential only area and sited at the highest point in the immediate vicinity. The back of the

Plough Inn, where such activities will take place, overlook those residential properties. There is no

availability of noise shelter to any of the properties overlooked. The nuisance will consist of loud

noise and light together with the noise of the arrivals and departures of those attending the events.

Additionally, the application seeks to carry out these activities during the working week and on

Sunday nights. There is an obvious impact of the sleeping patterns of school aged children and

workers [reference GEN4 and other policies].

If the licence is granted as drawn the types of events that could be run under this consent may

create a situation where there is regular excessive alcohol consumption and as a result the potential

for an increase in alcohol related crime. With the limited use of the Saffron Walden Police Station, if

criminal activities were to occur it is likely that the Police would have to make the journey from

Braintree. This increase the amount of time it takes for the Police to be able to respond to a

situation making their support to the local community much less effective. This would create

possible crime and disorder issues and threaten public safety.

We would be prepared to support a limited license application which relates to internal activities

only save for the consumption of alcohol in the beer garden but bearing in mind condition 4(i) of

planning permission UTT/2022/11/FUL. There should also be limits consistent with the normal

opening hours of a public house with a late limit of 11pm.

Re: Application for grant of a license in respect of The Plough Inn, Radwinter, Essex CB10

Thank you for your recent communication regarding the above license.

Whilst welcoming the prospect of our village having its pub back, we must object to the current application on a number of grounds:

- To allow The Plough to play live and recorded music and show films, both indoors and outdoors, until the late hours stated would cause considerable public nuisance to many of the households in the vicinity, including ours, which is situated 3 houses down from the pub premises. The times proposed are incompatible with the quiet rural setting in which the pub is situated and which the neighbouring residents value so highly. Not only would householders have to contend with music and/or soundtrack, but also face the prospect of car doors slamming, loud voices and the sound of car engines as people leave the premises.
- Events going on until the proposed times would encourage customers to continue drinking and, as the majority
  of these would probably be travelling by car, there may well be a danger that this would encourage driving
  when over the legal limit; this would constitute a crime and a danger to public safety.
- Under the protection of children from harm heading, we are also concerned that children in the area would find their sleep patterns disturbed by late night noise. Our son, a student at Saffron Walden County High School, whose bedroom faces towards the pub premises, should not be expected to contend with either noise caused by late night music or films or noise caused by customers emerging from the pub at midnight on a Thursday and 1.00am on a Friday and Saturday. In our view, these are unreasonably late hours; our son's general health could well be harmed by this proposal.

In conclusion, we would ask you to agree with us that the current application is entirely inappropriate in that it is attempting to turn a rural pub in a small, quiet village into a type of nightclub and one that is open at virtually all hours of the day and night. By all means grant a license to sell alcohol during reasonable hours, but please don't allow the peace and tranquillity of our lovely village to be shattered by intrusive noise and disturbance both night and day.

We would be very grateful if you could acknowledge receipt of this letter.

Thank you very much for taking the time to meet with me last Friday and helping me understand the License application process regarding the Plough Inn, Radwinter.

As I mentioned to you I live at the start of the Ashdon Road in Radwinter, diagonally opposite the Plough. I am supportive of any efforts to provide a village pub. I do have serious concerns regarding the terms of the application for a license that has been made for the Plough.

As you kindly explained representations regarding the license should be based one or more of the four licensing objectives. My concerns relate to the object The Prevention of Public Nuisance and are as follows:

- 1) The terms of the license that has been applied for could cause significant nuisance of myself and neighbours in the vicinity of Sampford Road, Ashdon Road and Plough Hill.
- 2) The application for live music outside in the garden or outside space or within a marquee on this space would cause significant noise nuisance.
- 3) Similarly the application for recorded music out in the garden or outside space or with in a marquee on this space would cause significant noise nuisance.
- 4) Similarly the application for films in the garden or outside space would cause significant noise nuisance.
- 5) The application for live or recorded music and film within the premises could cause noise nuisance if this is above an ambient background music level.
- 6) The license times applied for seem extensive and excessive and these hours of operation would there would likely be noise from customers entering and leaving the car park, within the garden of the pub and from within the premies. In particular the late night closing times are of great concern because of the likelihood of noise nuisance.

Outside events on an exceptional basis could be covered, as I understand it, by a Temporary Events Notice application.

Radwinter is an extremely quiet and peaceful village and I believe that terms consistent with the practice of other village pubs in vicinity would be more appropriate than the terms that have been applied for.

I would be most grateful if you can confirm that this representation by eMail is sufficient and that a written copy is not required.

We wholeheartedly support the re-opening of The Plough and wish Mr. Miles and his family success with their venture.

The application is for the sale of alcohol by retail for consumption, indoors and outdoors exhibition of films and indoors and outdoors performances of live and recorded music until 11:30pm from Monday to Wednesday, 12 midnight on Thursday, 1:00am on Friday and Saturday and 10:30pm on Sunday.

We do have a number of issues with the application as published, which could infringe the following licensing objectives:

#### Public Safety

The hours applied for the sale of alcohol finish considerably later than the time until which the sale of alcohol is permitted in public houses in the surrounding villages and is likely to motivate people to drive to The Plough to participate in these happenings when the surrounding public houses close. Indeed the whole purpose of staging these events is to draw potential customers to The Plough from elsewhere and generate a larger sales revenue than is likely to be obtained from the residents of Radwinter alone.

An increase in the numbers of drivers to and from The Plough, whether or not they have been drinking, will create an unnecessary hazard.

We should support an application for the sale of alcohol by retail for consumption to 11:00pm from Monday to Saturday and 10:30pm on Sunday.

#### The Prevention of Public Nuisance

The noise generated by the outdoors exhibition of films and outdoors performances of live and recorded music will have a considerable impact on the inhabitants of properties situated at the eastern end and in the centre of the village, will degrade the qualities of our lives in numerous ways and will prevent us from the peaceful enjoyment of our homes.

We should support an application for the indoor exhibition of films and the performance of live and recorded music provided that an acceptable boundary decibel level is specified and enforced.

#### The Protection of Children from Harm

The noise generated by the outdoors exhibition of films and outdoors performances of live and recorded music during the evening will prevent children from sleeping them and will cause them harm.

We should support an application for the indoor exhibition of films and the performance of live and recorded music provided that an acceptable boundary decibel level is specified and enforced.

We should not object to the occasional application for a Temporary Event Notice for the outdoors exhibition of films or performances of live and recorded music during the afternoon provided that the activity ended at a reasonable time.

We repeat that we support this application but request the above three amendments to it.

Thank you for your helpful comments regarding the application for a Premises License at The Plough Inn, Radwinter.

Although we have been, and continue to be supportive of the venture restoring the pub to its position in the village, we have some concerns regarding the details of the application.

We understand that we can make representations based on the four licensing objectives. In this instance, our comments relate the objective (c) The Prevention of Public Nuisance.

Under this category, we feel that some of the terms of the license as applied for could constitute a significant nuisance to ourselves as direct neighbours, and others in Sampford Road and Plough Hill.

- The proposed license times would seem excessive for a country pub leaving open the probability that there could be noise from customers within the premises, and in the garden and car park into the early hours of the morning
- The application includes full mandate for live music both within the premises and in the beer garden and any other part of the site including any marquee. This would be wholly unacceptable as, again there would be significant noise nuisance to neighbours.
- Likewise the application for amplified recorded music may have an adverse impact regarding noise, except for ambient background music in the bar area.


We feel that license terms consistent with similar music oriented pubs (for example The Bluebell Inn, Hempstead) would be more appropriate.

UDC Environmental Health object to grant of the premises licence at The Plough Radwinter as applied for. The hours and activities applied for do not satisfy the licensing objective of Prevention of Public Nuisance. The application includes the provision of films and live and recorded music indoors and outdoors until 23:30 Mondays to Wednesdays, 24:00 on Thursdays and 1 am on Fridays and Saturdays, with an additional hour at Bank Holidays. I note that the submitted plan of the premises does not include any outdoor areas within the licensed area.

The Plough is adjacent to residential dwellings. Music and film after 23:00 outdoors (including in a marquee) would cause a noise nuisance to these properties. Outdoor music and film before 23:00 would also constitute a nuisance if performed frequently. I recommend that outdoor music and/or film is restricted to not more than 12 occasions per year, and in no case later than 23:00 hours. The applicant has agreed verbally that this would be acceptable to him.

To prevent nuisance from noise breakout the noise emitted from the premises, measured as a 5 minute Leq, should not exceed 45dB(A) after 22:00 at the boundary with Plough Cottage.

In view of the late hours of opening, a condition is recommended requiring adherence to an agreed noise management plan, detailing the measures to be taken to control noise from external areas, including the front and rear gardens, car park and smoking shelter, after 11pm.

Further to our meeting on Tuesday, I have told Murray Hardy that you are agreeable to using TENS for outdoor music occasions, and he will contact you regarding the procedure to alter your application on this point.

With respect to the boundary noise condition, you said that you are not prepared to provide your own noise assessment. I agree that the 34dB would be overly restrictive in your case, so I have recommended a limit of 45 dB at the boundary after 10pm. This is not in line with the licensing policy, and the committee may not accept it. You will have an opportunity to argue your position.

As I said on Tuesday, I have also recommended a condition requiring adherence to an agreed noise management plan detailing the measures you will take to control noise from the car park, gardens and smoking shelter after 11pm.

Two other premises where we agreed alternative boundary noise conditions are the Crown House at Great Chesterford and Linden House in Stansted.
