Human Rights/Legal Implications	Under section 61 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 District Councils may suspend or revoke a

	driver's licence where the driver has been convicted of one of a range of specified offences since the grant of the licence or for any other reasonable cause. Where a driver ceases to meet the council's licensing standards that would be a reasonable cause for revoking a licence.
	In the event of a licence being suspended or revoked a driver has a right of appeal to the Magistrates' Court. The driver may continue to drive during the appeal period and if an appeal is lodged within that time until such time as the appeal has been determined unless any suspension or revocation is expressed to take immediate effect in the interest of public safety.

Situation

- 1. Cezar Ioan Popescu of The House, Summer House Farm, New Road, Melbourn, Royston, Hertfordshire, SG8 6DL is currently licensed by Uttlesford District Council as a private hire/hackney carriage driver. He has held this licence since 03 June 2014, and his current licence is due to expire on 31 May 2016.
- 2. On 26 November 2015, the Council's licensing department received information from members of the licensed trade. They reported that apparently, 4 to 6 weeks ago Mr Popescu went into a petrol station on the A505 in Royston to buy some alcohol but the cashier refused to sell it to him. Mr Popescu drove off and the cashier telephoned the police. The police chased him, he crashed the car and he was caught drink/driving.
- The Enforcement Officer made an enquiry with Essex Police about this allegation and received a response by email on 04 December 2015. PCSO Johnson reported that the officer dealing with the case is based at Parkside Police Station in Cambridge. The officer is PC 2513 Pulley and she supplied me with Hertfordshire reference number: AS 15/35SP/01/3053H.
- 4. The Enforcement Officer made enquiries with Hertfordshire Police and Cambridgeshire Police but at the time that this report was drafted received no information has been received. An attempt has been made to contact Mr Popescu by telephone but again no response was received.

- 5. The licensing department carried out an online driver check against Mr Popescu which searches the DVLA records. This check was carried out on 10 December 2015, which showed that he is disqualified from driving until 09 September 2017 for a DR10 offence. A DR10 offence is for driving or attempting to drive with alcohol level above limit. The check shows that the offence took place on 24 October 2015 and the conviction was on 10 November 2015.
- 6. Mr Popescu failed to report this conviction which is a breach of his drivers conditions as he has a duty to report any conviction within seven days. Mr Popescu no longer meets the Council's licensing standards for drivers as he has been disqualified from driving and appears before members for them to consider whether he remains a fit and proper person to retain his private hire/hackney carriage driver's licence.

APPENDIX A

LICENSING STANDARDS – DRIVERS

- 1. No more than 9 points endorsed on a driver's licence within the last 3 years.
- 2. No convictions or fixed penalty notices endorsed on a driver's licence within the last 3 years where 6 or more points have been endorsed in respect of a single offence.
- 3. Where a driver has been disqualified from driving for any reason a licence will not normally be granted for 3 years after the disqualification has expired or 12 months after the date the driver's licence is re-issued whichever is the later.
- 4. For the purposes of paragraph 3 above where a driver has accumulated 12 or more points in a 3 year period but has not been disqualified at the discretion of the court he or she will be deemed to have been disqualified at the date of the hearing when the magistrates exercised their discretion not to disqualify and the deemed disqualification shall be taken as having expired on that date.

And (save for limited licences as referred to in paragraph 2.5 of the policy):-

- No criminal convictions for an offence of dishonesty, indecency or violence in respect of which a custodial sentence (including a suspended custodial sentence) was imposed
- No criminal convictions within the last 5 years for an offence of dishonesty, indecency or violence in respect of which a non-custodial sentence was imposed
- 7. No other criminal convictions which are not deemed to be spent within the meaning of the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974.
- 8. No conditional discharges for any offence within the last 12 months.
- 9. No official cautions (save for cautions administered by Uttlesford District Council) for any offences within the last 12 months.
- 10. No pending prosecutions for any criminal or motoring offence.
- 11. Not to have had a hackney carriage and/or private hire driver's licence revoked within the last 3 years.
- 12. To meet group 2 medical standards as published by the Department of Transport.

13. To have a reasonable command of the English language sufficient to enable the driver to perform the functions of a hackney carriage/private hire driver
