Situation

6. The Council adopted its Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) in July 2006 following the statutory process. The document sets out the Council's approach to public consultation and involvement in the preparation of the Local Plan, other development plan documents and in the determination of planning applications.
7. On the 8th March 2013 the LDF Working Group agreed to a 6 week period of consultation for the Draft SCI. The Draft SCI was posted on the website and e-mails/letters were sent to all Statutory Consultees, the consultation was also advertised through social media. The closing date was the 6th May. 15 representations were received.
8. Officers have considered all of the representations made during the consultation period and have suggested a number of amendments to the draft SCI. the proposed amendments are detailed in the accompanying report.
