# Situation

- 6. An Appropriate Assessment is carried out to make sure that sites which are important for biodiversity at a European level are protected and will not be damaged by proposals contained in a Local Plan.
- 7. The requirement for Appropriate Assessments of plans or projects is outlined in Article 6(3) and (4) of the European Communities (1992) Council Directive 92/43/EEC on the conservation of natural habitats and of wild fauna and flora ('Habitats Directive'). The Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2012 transpose the requirements of the European Birds and Habitats Directives into UK legislation.
- 8. The Council last completed an Appropriate Assessment in 2007 for the Core Strategy Preferred Options document. Since then the Council's strategy and Local Plan has changed, therefore a review of the Appropriate Assessment is needed.
- 9. An Appropriate Assessment has been carried out for Uttlesford's Draft Local Plan to assess if the plan will have a negative effect on any of the identified European sites. It is a statutory requirement to consult Natural England and have regard to any comments they make. Natural England were asked to comment on Uttlesford Habitats Regulation Assessment and they confirmed that the assessment has been carried out in line with appropriate legislation and agree with the report's conclusions that the Local Plan would not be likely to have a significant effect on a European Site either alone or in combination with other plans or projects, and no further assessment work is required.
- 10. Once the group notes and supports the updated Appropriate Assessment it will be made available on the Council's website and will become part of the evidence base. There is no legal requirement to go out on further consultation.
- 11. The Habitats Regulation Assessment is attached in full along with Natural England's consultation response.
