#### **Area Panel Support**

#### **Leisure and Cultural Grants**

Since 2003 Uttlesford District Council has given grant aid in the form of the Leisure and Cultural Grant scheme. The Scheme is open to talented individuals, non-profit making organisations and local charities providing services to/for the community and/or for the purpose of assisting the arts,

- sports and cultural clubs. Applications from those residents/established for less than 6 months will **not** be considered.
- Arts, sports and cultural projects/initiatives, which benefit individuals or residents of the Uttlesford District e.g. equipment, training, coaches etc are eligible to apply. N.B. Grants will **not** be given for on-going costs and projects which have already taken place.
- The maximum grant given under the Leisure & Cultural Grant scheme is £500. Applicants must have raised 100% match funding towards the Project/Initiative. Decisions are made by the Chairman of the Community Committee on1st of each month providing the application form is received by the Funding and Strategic Partnerships Officer by 16th of the preceding month. If the application is successful, payment is made within two weeks of the date of the decision being made.
- The following applications from the North area have received a grant award this financial year:
  - 1. Saffron Walden Initiative- Follow up to 'Salsa in the Square' and 'Zorba in the Square'. This year event is called 'Dance in the Square' with a ceilidh band. £300
  - 2. Strethall Church Fabric Appeal- Two concerts held annually to fund raise for the church fabric appeal for essential maintenance. Grant would be for help towards cost of performers' fees. £200

## **Bodycare**

- Bodycare is a 5-week health promotion scheme run by Uttlesford District Council's Sports Development Officer in partnership with Uttlesford Primary Care Trust. The scheme fits very well into the national curriculum, meeting most of the Health Related Exercise Learning Outcomes for Key Stage 2. These include:
  - Safety Issues
  - ♦ Exercise Effects
  - Health Benefits
  - Activity Promotion

It is also possible to link the scheme into the science programme. The scheme is ideally suited for children in years 5 and 6 and aims to:-

- Encourage children to become more active away from school.
- Teach children the effects of exercise and how the body changes during exercise.
- Teach children the benefits of exercise and an active lifestyle.
- Teach children the importance of a balanced diet and energy balance.

The lessons last one hour and cover a range of classroom and practical activities.

- Week 1 Exercise and its Effects on the Heart. Fitness Test
- Week 2 Breathing and how the Body Changes during Exercise.

  Heart and Lung Circuit.
- Week 3 The Importance of a Balanced Diet. Balancing your Energy Game.
- Week 4 Healthy Lifestyles. Making up Games.
- Week 5 Quiz on Topics Covered. Second Fitness Test.
