### Play Strategy

- 5 Uttlesford District Council working with Partners has recently produced a Play Strategy which contained a portfolio of projects that were submitted to the Big Lottery for funding. We are very pleased to report that we were successful in achieving an award of £200,000 from the Big Lottery and the community play projects that will benefit in this area are as follows:

### Reality Roadshow

- 6     The first Reality Roadshow to be held in Uttlesford is due to take place in February 2008. Reality Roadshow is a life skills awareness course developed as an instructional, educational and crime prevention scheme for year 9 students aged 13/14 years old.

The event will be run in the four main secondary schools in Uttlesford with young people from the Friends School attending the day at Mountfitchet Maths and Computing College. Similar to Motorwise young people will spend the day attending workshops which focus on issues that influence their social development. Workshops will include an interactive theatre scenario, First Aid, Drugs & Alcohol, The Law & Antisocial Behaviour, Fire [Arson & Hoax Calls], Road Safety, Sexual Health.

The event is delivered in a partnership with other agencies comprising UDC Community Safety, UDC Community Development, ECC Road Safety, Essex Police Schools Liaison Officers, Essex Fire and Rescue, North West Essex PCT and Essex Youth Service.

### Holiday Programme

- 7     The District Council will not be running a Holiday Programme for the foreseeable future, however Leisure Connection Ltd., will be running some sports development courses during February Half-Term and the Easter holidays.

### October Half Term Holiday Programme

- 8     The October half-term week programme took place from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> October 2007 and comprised the following activities: Harlow Outdoor Adventure Day, Multi-Sports Games Day, Secrets from the Tomb of Tutankhamen, Cycle Safety Course, Golf Coaching Camp, Pottery, and Racket Sports. Around 120 young people attended the courses from all over the Uttlesford locality.
