Summary

1. This item seeks the Committee's consideration of an objection received in respect of the making of a tree preservation order (TPO) on a pine tree in the grounds of 22 West Road, Saffron Walden. The objection has been made by the occupiers of a neighbouring property.

Situation

- 5. In the interests of amenity a tree preservation order was made on the 26th June 2013 protecting a pine tree in the grounds of 22 West Road [appendix 1].
- 6. The pine tree is a mature specimen of some 12m in height situated in the front garden of 22 West Road and close to the boundary with 20 West Road. The tree is a prominent feature in the street scene, contributing to the quality and fabric of this part of the conservation area [appendix 2].
- 7. An objection to the making of the TPO has been received from the adjoining neighbours at 20 West Road. The grounds of objection are as follows: Pine cones from the tree block roof gutters causing a risk of water damage and we have to constantly sweep cones off our driveway and path. Pigeon droppings fall onto our car. We have five children and are fearful of the constant hazard of falling debris/branches from the tree.
- 8. It is not disputed that the tree sheds pine cones and that these fall onto the parking area and path at No.20. Whilst this may be an annoyance it is unlikely that this constitutes an actionable nuisance. Previous pruning of the branch tips overhanging part of the roof of No.20 has reduced the risk of cones blocking the roof guttering.
- 9. Pigeon droppings are inevitably a source of irritation by falling on parked vehicles. However, it is unlikely that this would be considered an actionable nuisance.
- 10. There is no evidence to indicate that the tree is in a dangerous condition.
