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#### Situation

At the last meeting members approved a draft work plan for 2010/11 to include a review of emergency planning and business continuity within the authority. This had been highlighted as an area in which other authorities have recently carried out reviews and Members noted this was an area of concern for many residents, not just in terms of internal arrangements but also in the ways this council linked to other organisations. There are two aspects to this issue: ensuring the external service that the Council delivers to residents is maintained in the event of an emergency and that the internal arrangements for the continued functioning of key processes are in place, for example where something happened to the Saffron Walden premises. It was considered important that the council should have a robust business continuity plan in place.
