Situation

Area Panel Support

As agreed by Members at the last Area Panel meeting, the Chairman of the Panel and the Champion have held further drop-in sessions for residents living in our area. The majority of these meetings have been held in the evenings from 7 – 8.30 pm in local village halls in the following areas: Stansted, Ugley, Elsenham, Hatfield Heath, Berden, Farnham, Manuden and Takeley. Two further sessions are taking place the first in Birchanger on 1 December, 7 – 8.30 pm and then at the Takeley Community Centre 10 am – 12 noon on 8 December. The purpose of these informal meetings is to afford members of the public an opportunity to ask questions/raise concerns relating to services the Council provides.

It is envisaged that further drop-in sessions will take place around the south west of the district in early April 2007.

The Area Champion has written to five parish councils, namely Manuden, Birchanger, Farnham, Berden and Hatfield Broad Oak to ask if they wish to have a presentation at their Parish Council meeting from the Chairman and herself on the work of the Area Panels. Leisure and Cultural Grants

- Since 2003 Uttlesford District Council has given grant aid in the form of the Leisure and Cultural Grant scheme. The Scheme is open to talented individuals, non-profit making organisations and local charities providing services to/for the community and/or for the purpose of assisting the arts, sports and cultural clubs. Applications from those residents/established for less than 6 months will **not** be considered.
- Arts, sports and cultural projects/initiatives, which benefit individuals or residents of the Uttlesford District e.g. equipment, training, coaches etc are eligible to apply. N.B. Grants will **not** be given for on-going costs and projects which have already taken place.
- The maximum grant given under the Leisure & Cultural Grant scheme is £500. Applicants must have raised 100% match funding towards the Project/Initiative. Decisions are made by the Chairman of the Community Committee on1st of each month providing the application form is received by the Funding and Strategic Partnerships Officer by 16th of the preceding month. If the application is successful, payment is made within two weeks of the date of the decision being made.
- The following applications from the south west area have received a grant award in this financial year:
 - Katy Jameson, 18 years old from Elsenham Contribution towards the cost of attending the Global Young Leaders Conference in America. £200
 - Jordan Chamberlain, 12 years old from Little Hallingbury Contribution towards the cost of one week's intensive tennis coaching in Spain. £200

The Village Music Club, Stansted - Contribution towards the forthcoming season of concerts. £250

- Teach children the effects of exercise and how the body changes during exercise.
- Teach children the benefits of exercise and an active lifestyle.
- Teach children the importance of a balanced diet and energy balance.

The lessons last one hour and cover a range of classroom and practical activities.

- Week 1 Exercise and its Effects on the Heart. Fitness Test
- Week 2 Breathing and how the Body Changes during Exercise.

 Heart and Lung Circuit.
- Week 3 The Importance of a Balanced Diet. Balancing your Energy Game.
- Week 4 Healthy Lifestyles. Making up Games.
- Week 5 Quiz on Topics Covered. Second Fitness Test.

We currently have 17 schools signed up to the scheme which equates to 54% of all the primary schools in the District, those primary schools participating from the south west area are: Bentfield, Takeley and Birchanger.

October Sports and Arts Programme

A number of courses have been remained the same for some time and the Sports and Arts Development Officers will be looking to introduce new activities and formats in the New Year.
