Members noted that the Working Party had been set up at the last meeting of the Policy & Resources Committee with

- (a) does the proposal provide an opportunity for the District to be promoted and marketed more effectively, thereby benefiting the communities and residents of Uttlesford?
  - (b) is the proposal of a one-off, project based or pump-priming nature?
  - (c) if No to (b) above, has consideration been given to how ongoing costs are to be met from other sources?
  - (d) the proposal must come from officers or Members of the Council and cannot be received **directly** from external organisations.

The Working Party then gave detailed consideration to 13 applications which had been submitted under this scheme. Members of the Working Party stated that they had great difficulty in dealing with these applications, particularly as many of them, whilst being very worthwhile, did not meet the criteria. In particular, application DPB/004 for the Age Concern - Home Support Scheme was viewed extremely sympathetically. However, Members were unable to put forward a recommendation for a contribution under this scheme as it did not meet the criteria. Members found this decision extremely difficult as, had they been able to provide the £6,000 funding requested, this would have been matched by the North Essex Health Authority and Essex County Council. Accordingly, the Working Party felt that the Council should look at other ways of assisting this scheme.

The Working Party noted that, prior to the criteria being established for the District Promotions Budget, Members had suggested that the payment of the Arts & Community Centre Feasibility Study (application DPB/013) should be funded from this budget.
