Title: Uttlesford Shopfront Design Guide

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# Summary

- 1. This Design Guide SPD is intended to provide detailed advice on matters relating to shopfront design, including the repair or refurbishment of existing shop-frontages, the reinstatement of lost frontages and details, or the introduction of new shopfronts; to ensure a consistent and high level of design and quality across the district.
- 2. The design guide SPD has been subject to a 6-week consultation and changes have been made following this consultation, the changes mainly being positive additions suggested by Historic England.

3. That Cabinet adopts the accompanying 'Uttlesford Shopfront Design Guide' document as a Supplementary Planning Document.
